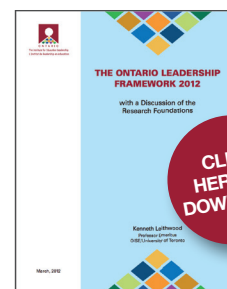

Ken Leithwood is Professor Emeritus at the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education (OISE) of the University of Toronto. He is a world renowned expert in the field of educational leadership, with many books and papers in the field. His research and writing focuses on school leadership, educational policy and organizational change. Dr. Leithwood has published more than 70 referred journal articles and authored or edited more than 30 books. He is the senior editor of both the first and second *International Handbooks on Educational Leadership and Administration* (Kluwer Publishers, 1996, 2003) and is the author of the Ontario Leadership Framework (2013). Among his current research projects is a large, five-year, Wallace Foundation study with colleagues aimed at determining how state, district and school-level leadership influences student learning. Dr. Leithwood is also the recent recipient of the University of Toronto's Impact on Public Policy Award.
